

Specific Needs for the Off-Track/Out-of-School Youth Population

Population segment	Definition	What need to ensure is in place
“Young and far”	Over-age/off-track students age 16 or older, with enough credits/skill to graduate in three years	
“Late-entrant English Language Learners”	Over-age English Language Learners who enter the school system during high school	
“Old and close”	Over-age/off-track students age 17 or older, with enough skills/credits to graduate in one year	
“Old and far”	Over-age/off-track students age 17 or older, with few credits/low skills, and an eighth-grade reading level	
“Old and very far”	Over-age/off-track youth, age 17 or older, with a below-eighth grade reading level
